

Dr. Thomas Pendergrass is professor of pediatrics and adjunct professor of epidemiology at the University of Washington in Seattle. Dr. Pendergrass received his M.D. degree from the University of Tennessee School of Medicine. He did his pediatric training at Northwestern-McGaw Medical Center and the Children's Memorial Hospital in Chicago. After serving in the Public Health Service with the Epidemiology Branch of the National Cancer Institute, he completed a fellowship in pediatric hematology/oncology and a fellowship in preventive medicine at the University of Washington. He has been on the faculty of the University of Washington since 1978. Dr. Pendergrass is author or coauthor of more than 120 articles, monographs, abstracts, and reviews.

As a clinician, he is a pediatric hematologist/oncologist. His special areas of interest are in the care of children with pediatric hematologic problems, especially thalassemia, other anemias, thrombocytopenia and coagulation disorders and children with retinoblastoma.

Dr. Pendergrass is a long-term advocate for children. He is active in the American Academy of Pediatrics both in Washington and nationally. He is a member of the Transportation Commission for the City of Kirkland.
