## **Estimated Timeline for Rule Making**

Inquiry

April 2017: CR-101 filed

Internal work with subject matter experts

May 2018: New CR-101

Proposal and Analysis

June – October 2018: TAC Meetings

Informal comment, analysis, key informant survey, finalize draft rule language

January 2020: Board briefing

**January 2020:** File CR-102

February – March 2020: Formal public comment Hearing and Adoption

March 2020: Public hearing and possible adoption

**April 2020**: File CR-103

**July 2020:** Rule becomes effective

## **Draft Rule – Format Changes**

Combine Provider and Facility Sections

Break the Rule into Parts

### **Draft Rule - New Conditions**

- 74 conditions added or modified
- Did not include from the 101:
  - Sleeping sickness
  - Fungal meningitis
  - Mandatory electronic laboratory reporting
- Removed:
  - Other rare diseases of public health significance
  - Disease of suspected bioterrorism origin


# Draft Rule – Existing Conditions

- Notification timeframes
- Narrowed test results for laboratories
- Clarified specimen submittal requirements
- De-identified negatives for five conditions




# Draft Rule – Administrative Changes

- Consistent data components between case reports and specimen submission forms and
- Means of notification heath care provider and health care facility and laboratories: No hand-written or mailed case reports
- Content of occupational traumatic injury hospitalizations
- Test results for out-of-state patients to Department of Health



## Draft Rule – Local Health Jurisdictions

- Washington Disease Reporting System (WDRS)
- Added 24-hour phone number
- Added immediately notifiable conditions
- Added 3 day response for all other conditions
- Added 3 day response when cases don't need investigation
- Content of notifications
- Local Health Officer diagnosis confirmation



# Draft Rule - Department of Agriculture

- Removed notification requirements for veterinarians
- Created notification requirements for Washington State Department of Agriculture
- Added consultation between Department of Health and Department of Agriculture
