PRENATAL TESTS - CONGENITAL AND HERITABLE DISORDERS

Updating the Prenatal Genetic Screening Rule Summary and Timeline
November 2020

Introduction

The State Board of Health (Board) is considering updating <u>chapter 246-680 WAC Prenatal Tests - Congenital and Heritable Disorders</u>, to bring Washington's rules into alignment with national standards of care and current best practices, as well as improving the clarity and usability of the rule.

Purpose

The current rule outlines screening and diagnostic tests that are considered to be medically necessary and are required to be included in benefits packages provided by insurers, health care service contractors, and health maintenance organizations. Prenatal screening and diagnostic testing can have a significant impact on pregnancies at risk for a genetic condition by enabling early diagnosis, providing an opportunity for appropriate health care, and empowering women and couples to make informed pregnancy related health decisions. Since the last rule update, national organizations such as the American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and the American College of Medical Genetics have put forward updated recommendations for prenatal screening and diagnostic testing.

Next Steps

The Board will work closely with the Department through the proposed rule change. Staff will send updates to the Board's prenatal screening interested parties list and post updates on the Board's website to outline how stakeholders can provide feedback, submit written comments, or provide testimony. Following the completion of a draft, the Board used a broader informal review and comment process to gather further input prior to the formal proposal of rules and public hearing. The Board will then receive a briefing on the proposal, comments, and next steps to inform the filing of the proposed rule.
