


Rulemaking Timeline



^{*}Original CR-101 filed in April 2017; the new CR-101 was filed in May 2018 after internal work with subject matter experts.

Proposed Rule

- Adds new conditions and notification requirements
- Changes notification requirements for existing conditions
- Revises current reporting requirements for veterinarians and the Washington State Department of Agriculture
- Administrative changes for usability, clarity



Proposed Rule: Supplemental CR-102

- Race and ethnicity reporting
- Adding Silicosis (clerical error)
- Additional administrative changes (e.g., SARS-CoV-2)




Direction from the Board

At its August meeting, the Board directed staff to explore the feasibility of including additional demographic reporting requirements in the Notifiable Conditions rules.

This was in response to public comment received that requested the Board include the following data components:

- Race
- Ethnicity
- Primary Language
- Gender Identity
- Sexual Orientation
- Disability Status



Staff Recommendation

- Board and Department staff recommend the Board:
 - Withdraw the current CR-102, which would expire next month if not withdrawn.
 - Continue working with subject matter and community experts, local health jurisdictions, and the regulated community to draft rule language for the Board's consideration to collect race, ethnicity, and language data for all notifiable conditions.
- Staff do not recommend delaying the rule hearing past March 2021.
 - Staff recommend prioritizing inclusion of additional data components the next time the notifiable conditions rule is opened for revision.


