Resolution 2022-02

WHEREAS the State Constitution established the Washington State Board of Health in 1889;

WHEREAS the Board provides a forum for developing public health policy in Washington State and is empowered to hold hearings and explore ways to improve the health status of the citizenry;

WHEREAS on November 16, 2012, Governor Christine Gregoire appointed Frances Bessermin to the Board to serve as a member representing consumers of health care; and Governor Inslee reappointed her 2015 and 2018;

WHEREAS Ms. Bessermin has accomplished this and more during her time as a Board member;
